• Diocese of Belleville, Illinois Cohorts

Discussion was held around the services offered by an organization called Parish Success Group. Father Mark attended a meeting to hear about joining a cohort of parishes in the process of reorganization. The commitment would include six sessions and would assist parish partnerships through the processes and decision making necessary for success. Each session would cost \$750. Fr. Mark Stec has kept our Parishes up-to-date and our Partnership is already working to make changes. Our Partnership will not participate in the upcoming cohort.

Faith Formation

- School Age- Current attendance: 27 PSR students at St. Joseph's Stringtown; 20 PSR at St. Joseph's Olney; 64 at Holy Cross Wendelin
 - Discussion included consideration of the following questions: Are we doing our best? Should we offer both family-based and classroom-based with one site? Integration of Catholic School and PSR?
 - No decisions were made for next year's program.
 - Caroline Trimble will be making rosaries with the Confirmation classes at St. Joseph's Olney.

High School-

- Mission Trip
- Combined Activities-seeing more collaboration and invitations between groups.
- Possibility of beginning an "open" gym time at St. Joseph's Olney was introduced.

• Adult Formation-Caroline Trimble report:

- Formed.org-10 people on average are visiting the site daily.
- o "J.O.Y.S."-positive comments received, providing structure for prayer life
- o Parish Mission-September 15-19, 2018; Fr. Jim Sichko will lead the week
- Another Michael Mette Concert-Councils recommended August 11 or 12 if he is available and would provide a "back to school" celebration.

- Lenten Adult Faith Formation-5:30 on Tuesdays. Each week centers around a different topic.
- Meals for Mom-a form of this is already in place for each Parish. New addition to this service will be Baptism to age 3 Faith Formation packets and ministry.
- St. Meinrad Youth Initiative-Our Partnership was not selected for funding. Caroline will continue to pursue useful resources for this purpose.
- Upcoming Opportunities:
 - Walking in Faith-Tuesdays and Thursdays when weather improves
 - St. Benedict Press: Kingdom of Happiness Study-Wednesday evenings this summer

Community Life

• Common Catholic Activities-Father Mark has been approached about a Parish Directory. This activity will not be pursued at this time.

Implementation of the Next Step

Results of the Bishop and Vicar Forane Meeting on January 22, 2018.

- 1. What is your weekend schedule? Do you have too many Masses? Which ones could be eliminated or consolidated?
- 2. How's your hospitality? Is there any form of fellowship in your weekend experience?
- 3. What preparation goes into the weekend experience?
- 4. What is our strengths, weaknesses, and opportunities for growth

Our Parish Partnership has been tasked with reducing the number of weekend Masses to three (3). Currently, 20 wedding ceremonies are scheduled for 2018, and on average, there are 30-40 funeral masses to provide each year. Masses are in addition to all of the other duties and responsibilities provided by the Priest. Options discussed included the possibility of Caroline Trimble providing funeral services, no longer having the option for Saturday funerals, opening wedding and/or funeral masses on weekends to the public (that would then be the Saturday mass for that Parish), and those trained for Sunday Celebration in the Absence of Priest being trained to offer funeral services. After discussion, the Pastoral Councils decided to informally seek input from each Parish and come back together in April to make a decision.

Parishioners are encouraged to seek out their Pastoral Council members and give opinions before April 23, 2018.
