Mission Trip Reflection:

Catholic Heart Work Camp 2024 - Milwaukee, WI Theme: "Here & Now"

Theme Verse: 1 Timothy 4:12

Two weeks ago, we took 44 campers on a mission trip with CHWC. I was immediately impressed with how our kids (and adults!) stepped out of their comfort zones and quickly stepped into the high energy programming of CHWC, loudly singing songs of praise, whole-heartedly participating in

silly dances, and courageously competing in goofy games on stage in front of everyone. Everyone worked so hard at their sites, serving those less fortunate than us. I was told over and over again throughout the week that our youth were such hard workers! Most of all, I was blown away with how easily everyone flipped the switch from the high energy fun, to quietly, intently, and reverently worshiping Jesus in Mass, adoration, and other times of prayer. It's so amazing to see so many teens taking a week of their summer to love others, to serve those that need it, and to grow closer to Jesus!

The theme of this year was "Here & Now". During this week, the kids answered the call to live in the moment, to be grateful of it, and to see Jesus and his graces in it.
